



# EYELASH EXTENSION AFTERCARE AND CONSENT FORM

## Procedural Description

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Eyelash extensions are used to give your natural lashes a fuller look. Unlike stick-on lashes, these extensions are applied using semi-permanent glue that makes them last about 3 to 5 weeks. Extensions are made of many materials, there are three main types: synthetic, silk, and mink. Lashes are applied in either clusters, fans, or individually. Depending on the application and various ways of eye mapping for different eye shapes, the extensions come out to give different looks.

We most commonly apply Volume lash extensions to our clients, a technique that uses two or more thin lash extensions (usually 0.05 mm to 0.07 mm in diameter) per natural eyelash. This technique enables licensed lash techs to create customized looks desired by the client. Thanks to its versatility, you can request any volume look to enhance your eye shape – from a subtle volumized lash to a more dramatic look. Volume lash extensions give incredible lash fullness and last longer than classic eyelash extensions. Regardless of which volume lash set you want, you will always head out of the studio with a light eyeshadow effect and a defined lash line with volume eyelash extensions. If you're not blessed with naturally voluminous, full lashes, then volume eyelash extensions might be the ideal lashes for you!

Lash extensions typically last the same lifetime as your natural lash cycle, which is between 4-6 weeks. However, to avoid them looking patchy as they grow out, we recommend touch-ups after 2 or 3 weeks to keep lashes looking completely full and uniform.

## Before Your Treatment

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- Please arrive at your lash appointment on time.
- Ensure your eyelashes and the surrounding eye area are completely free of any makeup products. Taking off mascara can be a time-consuming process, and will cut into your appointment time, leaving the provider with less time to properly work on giving you the desired look. Moreover, leftover makeup will hinder and prevent the proper application of extensions.
- No caffeine 2 hours before the appointment. It can cause your eyelids to jump nonstop and make the lashing process longer than the 2-hour time frame.
- If you wear contacts please remove them before the appointment.

## What To Expect During Treatment

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- Immediately after the lash application, some individuals with sensitivities can experience minor redness and dry eyes. We try to minimize this where possible, so we will ask if you are sensitive beforehand. In most cases, this disappears within an hour or so. Some people can have unknown allergies to adhesives, and find out after getting the lashes on. Please, call us if you are concerned, and the provider will walk you through the next course of action.
- It's normal to lose a couple of lashes every day (1-5). Don't be alarmed if you notice them from time to time (as they are much larger than your natural lashes so you notice them!). The extension falls out attached to the natural lash when it is ready to come out, and a new baby lash takes its place. Some days you won't lose any, other days you might lose 3 or 4. It's completely normal and does not mean your eyelashes are all going to fall out.

- Some lash growth cycles are faster than others. You may find every few months, your lashes shed faster than other times. It usually means that you have a lot of new growth, and when you come in we will see a lot more lashes we can lash! Other times they might still look great at 4 or 5 weeks, as they have not shed much.
- For clients seeking lash services beyond three appointments, we highly recommend using an eyelash growth supplement/serum. This contributes to maintaining the strength and health of their natural lashes, playing a crucial role in a healthy eyelash maintenance routine. Healthy lashes lead to more beautiful extension designs and improved extension retention. Moreover, thick and long eyelashes make the lash extension process easier and reduce application time. Combining lash serum with eyelash extensions results in a happy coexistence for a harmonious outcome.
- No two sets of lashes are identical. We customize the styling, sizes, weights, and curls to every individual's eye shape, natural lash condition, and taste. Each style looks different depending on your own eye shape. So please be aware that your lashes will not look identical to your friends, even if you request the exact same thing.
- Expect between 2 - 4 weeks before you need an infill. On average, our clients come back every 3 weeks. Sets consisting of more lashes (glam and volume) will usually last longer than those will less (full, lite). Shorter lashes usually last longer too.
- Eye irritation, discomfort & watering eyes can occur. To prevent this, please advise your technician if you feel stinging during the application.

## Post-Treatment Instructions

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- Avoid showering, swimming, the use of saunas, and steam rooms for the first 24 hours as this will affect your adhesive bond.
- Avoid all oil-based products and makeup remover around your eye area. Oil breaks down the chemical bonds of the glue and your lashes will fall off quickly.
- Avoid waterproof eye makeup and mascara.
- Do not pull, rub or sleep on lashes.
- Brush your lashes daily with a clean mascara wand. Do not use an eyelash curler, perm, or tint your eyelash extensions.
- Washing your lashes will make them last longer (wait 48 hours after application)! Please use a lash-specific shampoo to ensure proper cleansing. Be sure to cleanse daily to remove excess oils and debris.
- Clients with sensitivities or allergies should avoid drinking wine for the first 24 hours, as it may increase sensitivities and cause an allergic reaction.
- Lash shedding is a normal process that happens to all of us (with or without lash extensions). Book your fill every 2-3 weeks to keep your lashes looking full.

## Eyelash Extension Consent Form

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I have been advised the service(s) provided to me by this salon could have unfavorable results including, but not limited to allergic reaction, irritation, burning, redness, soreness, etc. I am aware that certain medications and over-the-counter products can significantly increase the risk of injury when combined with skin care services. I understand that Honey Skincare Studio does not recommend skin care services for customers using Retin-A, Accutane, and products contacting alpha hydroxyl, or any other skin thinning treatments. I hereby confirm that I am not using any medications that may cause or contribute to such injury/reaction, and I will advise my esthetician should I use any such medications in the future. I understand there are often inherent risks associated with skin care services, and I agree that as a condition of providing these services on an ongoing basis, I will not hold Honey Skincare Studio liable. Although good results are expected, there cannot be any guarantee or warranty expressed or implied with regard to the results that may be obtained. I understand that the following are among the expected side effects of Eyelash Extensions:

### **Epilepsy-**

A common condition that affects the brain and can cause frequent seizures. Seizures can appear suddenly, thus making them difficult to predict. Therefore it is not recommended to perform the treatment on clients with epilepsy.

**Allergic reaction**

Eyelash extensions use adhesives, tapes, glue, and gel pads that may cause an allergic reaction. I understand that there are risks associated with having eyelash extensions applied to or removed from my natural eyelashes. I further understand as part of the procedure that there is a potential possibility of an allergic reaction. Eye irritation, discomfort, watering eyes, and potential swelling can occur. I am aware that allergic reactions can get worse with every application. I am aware that allergic reactions cannot be reversed and may need medication to treat the reaction. I agree that I will move forward to let my lash artist perform services with the expectation that I may need to have them removed. We do not offer refunds for allergic reactions, but at no charge, we will gladly remove the lashes. You may have to follow up with a visit to your doctor. If you know that you have any allergies or sensitivities to any of the procedural ingredients, please notify your provider before the service is performed.

**Hypertension of 2nd/3rd stage-**

Hypertension is another word for high blood pressure. In stages 2 and 3, it can cause sudden heart attacks, strokes, and other complications.

**Hepatitis, HIV, and Syphilis -**

Infectious diseases can be transmitted through getting in contact with sores and blood.

**Alopecia areata-**

A common autoimmune disorder often resulting in unpredictable hair loss. In most cases, hair (including lashes) falls out in small patches around the size of a quarter. For most people, hair loss is nothing more than a few patches, though in some cases, it can be more extreme. Sometimes, it can lead to the complete loss of hair on the scalp (alopecia totalis) or, in severe cases, the entire body (alopecia universalis). Lash Lift is not recommended if hair loss is present, however slight.

**Incomplete eyelid closure-**

If a person closes their eyes but their eyelids don't close all the way, leaving a gap in which you can see the sclera, there's a high possibility of them getting a chemical burn from adhesive fumes. It's possible to work with such clients, but you'll need to fixate their lower eyelids with a small band-aid or a piece of surgical tape.

**Hair loss-**

There are several stages of this medical condition. If the person has most of their eyelashes intact, you can perform the procedure. But you must keep in mind that such clients have weaker, more fragile lashes, which you should take into consideration when choosing extensions for them. It's also possible that these clients' lashes will stay on for a shorter amount of time.

**Excessively oily skin and hair-**

Skin fat negatively affects the adhesive, so it's highly likely that such clients' lashes will stay on for a shorter amount of time, which you should warn them about beforehand.

**Oversensitive skin-**

Any kind of touch next to the oversensitive area is highly unpleasant for these clients, so the procedure might end up being extremely uncomfortable for them. Also, their risk of getting an allergic reaction is higher.

**Chemotherapy-**

Just like with hair loss, there are several stages of this condition, so if the client has most of their lashes intact, you can proceed with the procedure. But keep in mind that they might not be able to wear extensions for long, and their skin becomes more sensitive and prone to allergic reactions due to chemotherapy drugs.

**Pregnancy-**

If a pregnant woman should get eyelash extensions is a very popular question. There are no specific contraindications for the procedure, but every woman's body goes through a lot of changes during pregnancy. Sometimes those changes might be unpredictable. That heightens allergic reaction risk and increases skin fat secretion. Moreover, during the late stages of pregnancy, it's not recommended to spend a lot of time on your back.

I acknowledge the following has been discussed with me:

- I agree to have eyelash extensions applied to my natural eyelashes and/or removed and retouched. By signing this agreement, I consent to the placement and/or removal of the eyelash extensions by a certified eyelash extension professional.
- I understand that on rare occasions there are risks associated with having artificial eyelash extensions applied to or removed from my natural eyelashes. I further understand that in rare cases as part of the procedure eye irritation and discomfort could occur. I agree that if I experience these conditions with my lashes that I will contact the certified eyelash extension professional that performed this procedure and it may be beneficial to have the eyelashes removed.
- I understand that lash extension services have some inherent risk of irritation to the orbital eye area, including the eye itself, and could result in stinging and burning, blurring vision, and potential blindness should the adhesive enter the eye or should an allergic reaction occur.
- I understand that if the bonding agent comes into contact with my eye, my eye will be flushed with water and I will be assisted in seeking medical attention immediately.
- I understand and agree to the after-care instructions provided by the certified eyelash extension professional for the use and care of my eyelash extensions. I realized and accepted the consequences of failure to adhere to these instructions may cause the eyelash extensions to fall out and/or decrease the time the lashes will last.
- I understand and consent to having my eyes closed and covered for the duration of an approximately 60-120 minute procedure. Times may vary depending on the type and number of eyelashes applied.
- I understand that a full set of lash extensions can make the appearance of my own lashes about 30-50% thicker, and make my lashes appear 20-50% longer.
- I understand that this is a semi-permanent procedure, as my natural lashes will continue to grow and fall out normally, making touch-up or “fill” appointments necessary to maintain the original look achieved by replacing the lashes that have fallen out. Most clients require a fill appointment every 2-3 weeks.
