



BROW LAMINATION AFTERCARE AND CONSENT FORM

Procedural Description

Eyebrow Lamination is the latest beauty secret that will thicken and enhance your natural brows. Brow lamination will help you with gaps, thinning, unruliness, or overplucking your eyebrows. The brushed up, and polished results will visually increase the volume and expand the shape of your natural eyebrows. The hair length creates thickness, while baby hair covers holes and gaps. If your brow gaps are prominent, use eyebrow-enhancing serum to fill them in or ask during the procedure for a tint. Bonus, your eyes will look like they got a lift, and the results will last up to 6-8 weeks.

Before Your Treatment

- Avoid wearing eye makeup or remove it prior to the appointment.
- Have your brows shaped no less than 2 days before your brow lamination. No wax within 24 hours.
- Inform your aesthetician if you have had irritation from previous eyelash procedures, brow procedures, or skin products.
- There are many contraindications for brow lamination. If you have any of the following, please reschedule your appointment; Retinol use, recent microblading/permanent makeup, chemotherapy, sensitive skin/eyes, recent facial surgery, facial skin infections, eye infections, eye cysts, styes, or claustrophobia.
- Avoid skin treatments such as microdermabrasion, chemical peels and spray tan on the face 2 weeks prior to the appointment.

What to Expect During Treatment

- Results will last 4-6 weeks.
- Some people may develop dark or light spots in areas treated.
- Do not pull hairs in between your appointments since this may lead to asymmetry.
- The clinical result varies from one individual to another.

Day 1: Don't wet or rub your eyebrows for 48 hours. Don't apply any cream, oils, or makeup on your eyebrows. Avoid sun exposure, sunbeds, sauna, shower, excessive sweat, and swimming pools for 48 hours. Do not apply Retin-A, AHA (alpha-hydroxy acids), and do not exfoliate the brow area for at least 72 hours before or after the brow treatment. Avoid sleeping on your front within the first 24-48 hours.

Day 2: Avoid contact with direct sunlight, sunbeds, saunas, steam rooms, and swimming pools. Do not apply Retin-A, AHA ("alpha-hydroxy acids"), and do not exfoliate the brow area.

Day 3+: It is strongly recommended that you apply a conditioning eyebrow serum twice daily after brow lamination to maintain healthy, hydrated eyebrow hairs.

Post-Treatment Instructions

- Do not apply Retin-A, AHA or exfoliate around the brow area for three days before and after the treatment.
- No self-tanning products should be used on the face for 48 hours after treatment.
- Redness and mild swelling is normal after your treatment.
- Avoid putting water on your brows for the first 48 hours.
- Gently brush your brows every day with a dry mascara spoolie (we can provide).
- Do not trim brows as you may over-trim them.
- Do not apply any Latisse or brow creams, serums, or makeup for 48 hours after your brow lamination.

Brow Lamination Consent Form

The nature of the Brow Lamination treatment has been explained to me. I understand that just as there may be benefits from the treatment, all treatments involve risk to some degree. While brow lamination is not invasive, many people may face a few side effects like swelling, redness, peeling, itching, and bumps, which are all related to skin irritation caused by chemicals found in the solution used to create the laminating effect. These side effects can occur directly below and/or above the eyebrows and may even extend to your eyelids.

If you have sensitive skin, rosacea, eczema, or a history of contact dermatitis, you may want to speak with an aesthetician beforehand to do a spot test to see if you have any reaction. I understand that the following are among the expected side effects of the Brow Lamination treatment:

Redness/ Irritation:

Tinting/lifting brows could have some inherent risk of irritation to the orbital eye area, including the eye itself, and could result in stinging or burning, blurry vision, and potentially blindness should any of the solutions enter into the eye area.

Skin Irritation:

Irritation from solutions being used can include redness, peeling, swelling, bumps, and itching which can occur directly below or above the eyebrows or eyelids.

Over-Processed Eyebrow Hairs:

The solutions may damage your eyebrow hair. The lamination procedure involves applying a chemical that breaks down the bonds in your brow hairs. This could cause dry, brittle, frizzy, or broken brow hairs.

Unsatisfactory Results:

There's no quick fix for a bad brow lamination. If you don't like the way your brows look after the procedure, you may have to wait a few months for your brows to grow out naturally.

Allergic Reactions:

Brow Lamination can cause an allergic reaction. Eyebrow lamination may cause skin irritation, redness, and even eczema around the eye area due to the chemicals sitting on thin, delicate eyelid skin.

I acknowledge the following has been discussed with me:

- I understand the Risks / Complications / Side effects / Consequences associated with having an eyebrow lamination. I further understand that as part of the procedure, eye irritation, eye pain, eye itching, discomfort, and in rare cases, eye infection or blurriness could occur. I agree that if I experience any of these medical conditions with my eyebrows then I will contact my provider and consult a doctor at my own expense.
- I understand that even though my provider lifts the eyebrows using the proper technique, the instruments, tapes, cleaners, adhesives, and removers used may irritate my eyes or require a doctor's follow-up care.
- I understand and agree to the care instructions provided by my provider for the use and care of my permed and/or limited eyebrows. I realize and accept the consequences of failure to adhere to these instructions may cause the eyebrows to not stay permed as long as told.
- Financial Responsibilities - This procedure is elective and not medically necessary and therefore, not covered by insurance. Any complications requiring additional medical care and/or treatment or revisionary procedures would be the patient's responsibility also. There are no refunds.
